Criminal Code of the
Russian Federation



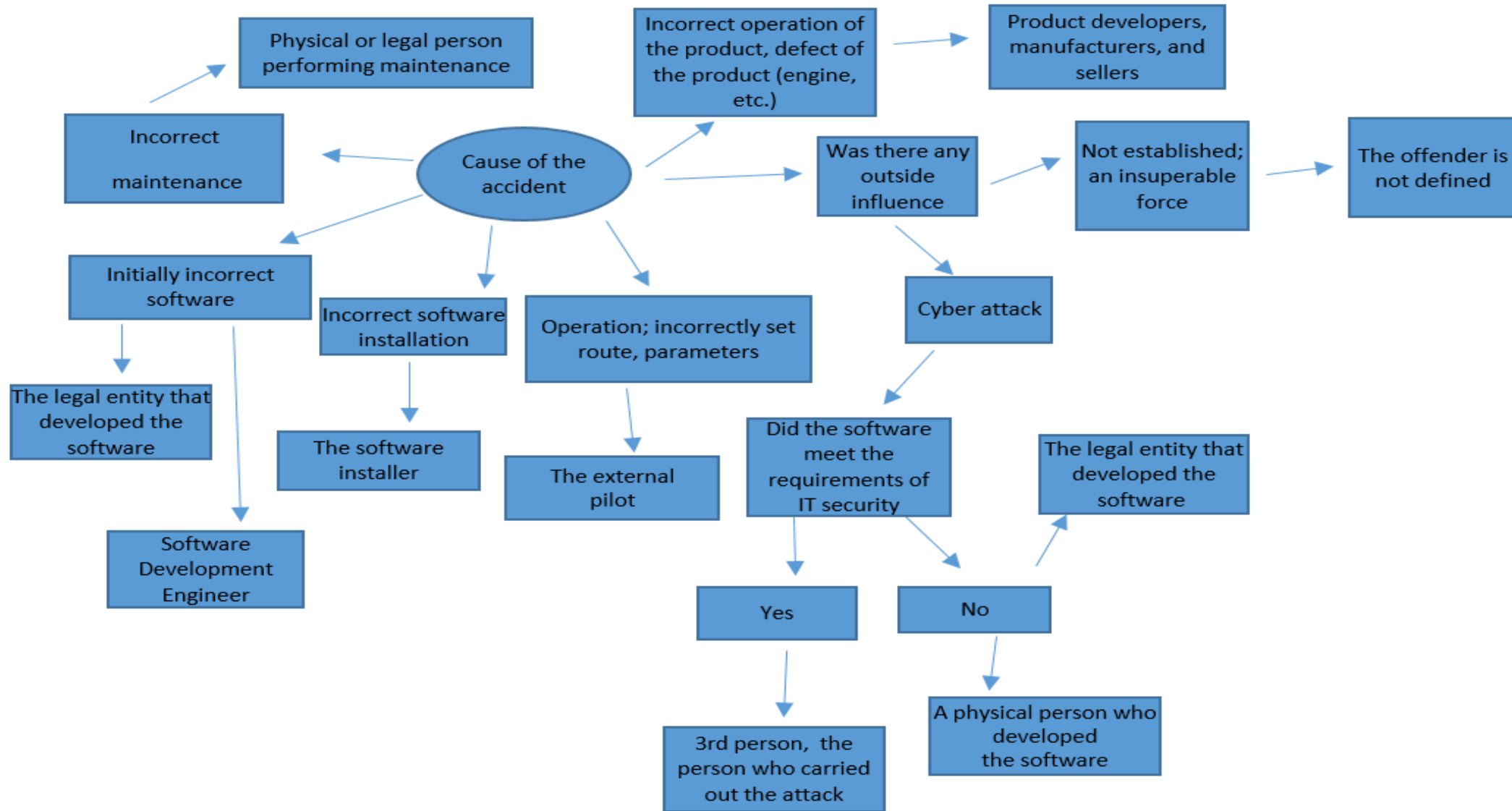
The subject of a crime means a sane individual who has reached the age of accountability established by the Criminal Code, and has committed a socially dangerous act prohibited by criminal law.

Article 2.1 of the
Administrative Code of
the Russian Federation



The subject of an administrative offense means a sane individual who has reached the age of accountability established by the Administrative Code, as well as a legal person who has is guilty of an illegal act (inaction) for which administrative responsibility is established

Algorithm for determining the offender

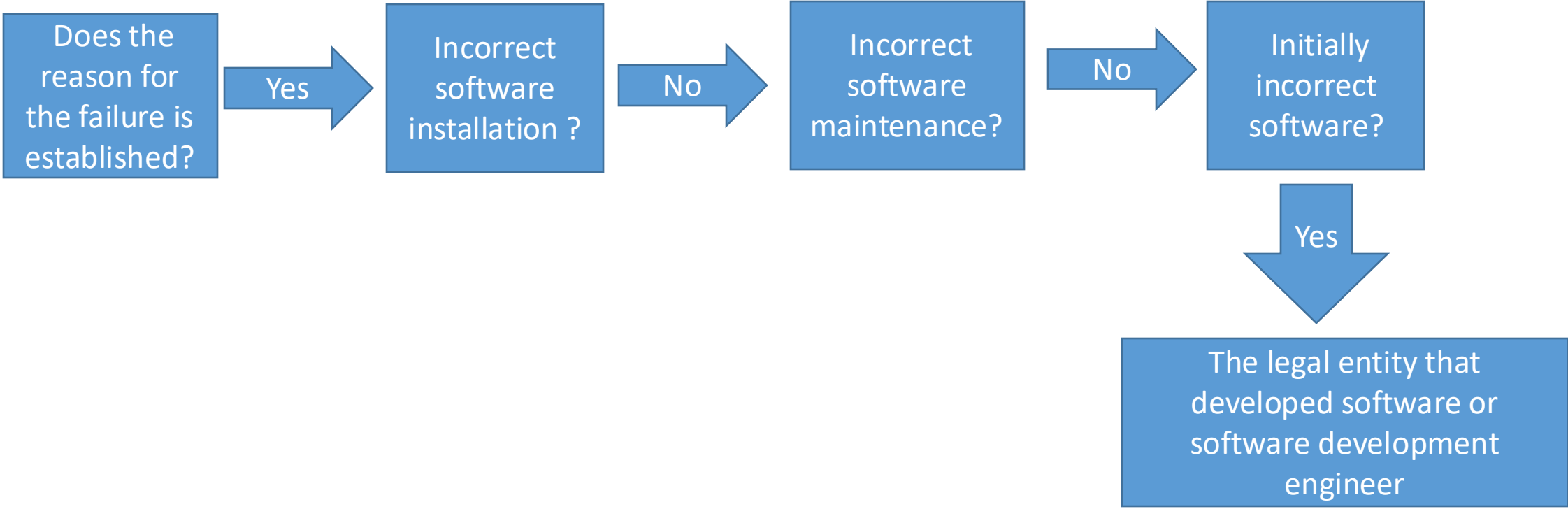




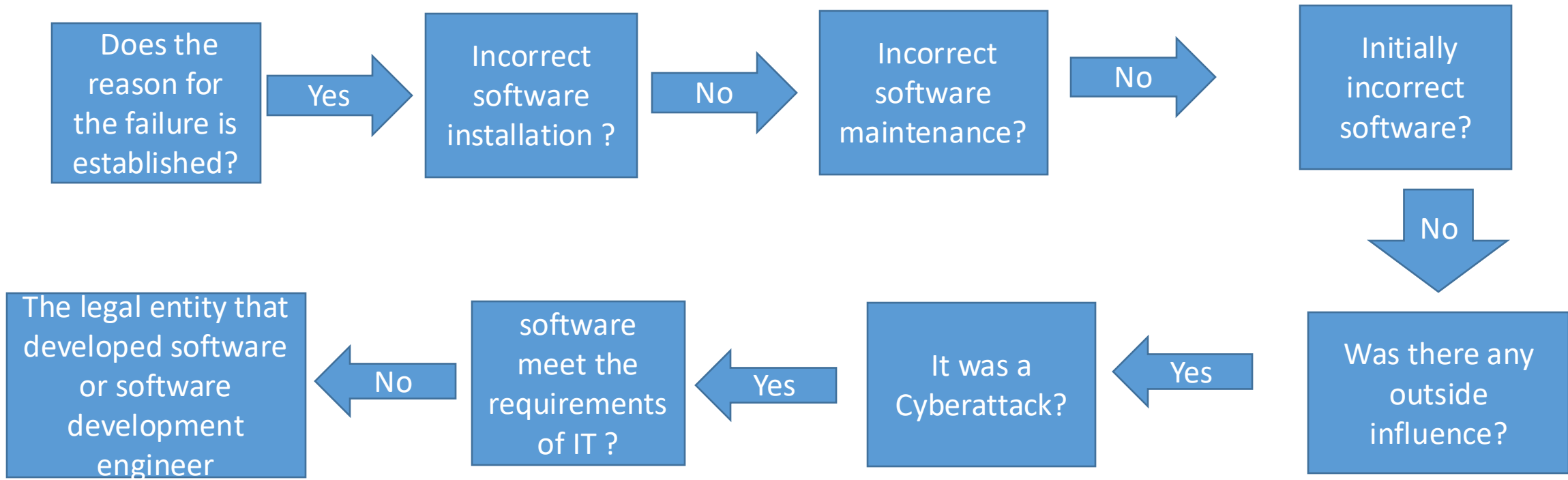
